Report regarding visit to Labpur Satyanarayan Siksha-Niketan Girls' High School, P.O.Labpur, Dist-Birbhum.

I had an occasion to visit Labpur Satyanarayan Siksha-Niketan Girls' High School, P.O.Labpur, Dist-Birbhum on December 21, 2018 as some administrative problems were reported from the school. Discussed the matter in details with Smt. Manisha Banerjee, Headmistress of the school and also with teaching and non-teaching staff.

2. The school is a government aided Higher Secondary School which caters to education for girls students only. This is a very old school, nearly 60 years but as it is a government aided school it is facing numerous problems regarding education, funding, teaching staff as well as hostel accommodation. The details are as follows :-

- a. The school is fully funded by Government so far as salary of teaching staff are concerned. However, they are not getting adequate funding for maintenance and development projects of the school.
- b. The school is only having Arts section and has no facility for teaching of sciences.
- c. No computer education or computer literacy programmes are being provided to the students of the school due to inadequate funding.
- d. There is only one non-teaching staff available who is on the verge of retirement. The Headmistress expressed apprehension that once this non-teaching staff retires, which is due within next two months time, no non-teaching staff would be available.
- e. There is shortage of over 08 to 10 teachers in various streams in the school which is affecting education.
- f. A boundary wall is urgently required for giving adequate safety and security to the girls students as the school is situated in an open

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

g. Presently, there is only one girls hostel in which there is accommodation is available in respect of 40 (forty) students. This is a comparatively old building and currently demands for hostel facilities have increased. Therefore, the Headmistress suggested creation of new hostel facilities for the school.

3. The Commission may please consider the note on issues raised above regarding the school and I would suggest that this can be sent to the Chief Secretary, Govt. of West Bengal for necessary action and for a action taken report to the Commission within next four months.
