Sir.

With reference to above, I am directed to inform that the recommendations of the Commission has been carefully examined by the Government along with views obtained from the Department of Health & Family Welfare on the issue.

After careful consideration of the recommendation as well as all aspects related to it, Government is of the view that :-

- 1. Human rights issues in matters of medical etiquette and professional standards are to be examined in light of the relevant guidelines/regulations laid down by the Medical Council of India.
- 2. The matter of apparent lack of consensus among the doctors, regarding the best course of treatment, may not be equated with or treated as a deliberate attempt to violate human rights. Such lack of consensus is not an unusual occurrence. It is dependent on a number of subjective and technical factors and often reflects genuine concern regarding a patient's well being.

Accordingly, I am directed to inform that the Government is not in a position to accept the said recommendation to pay the monetary compensation of Rs. 50,000/- (fifty thousand) to the petitioner Shri Krishnendu Sarkar.
