Taken to the Ratan Babur Ghat crematorium to be put on funeral pyre a "dead body" reportedly came alive.;

One of the kins of the deceased woman, complained of her being "alive" ust before her mortal remains were to be consigned to flames after they had allegedly discovered certain movements in the deceased though she was pronounced dead by a state-run hospital.

Taken aback by the weird and sudden turn of events the police present there had asked the kin of the deceased to take the body back at the state-run RG Kar hospital for further medical examina-

After a brief commotion, the kin though set out with the body for re-examination at the R G Kar hospital but they had refused to re-admit the patient in the hospital and instead they had decid-ed to take the body back to Madhyamgram, where the deceased was the resident. On her way to Madhyam-gram, the patient had died.

Sukumar Biswas, brother-in-law of the deceased Shivani Biswas (54) said that she was suffering from diabetes and hyper tension and was undergoing treatment at

RGKar hospital.

"She was pronounced dead by Dr Aritra Bhattacharya this morning. Accordingly, we took the body at Ratan Babur Ghat for cremation.
