Human Right Volunteers

West Bengal Human Rights Commission invites applications from teachers, advocates, doctors, engineers, other professionals, self employed persons, retired Govt. Servants, and any other interested person fulfilling the eligibility criteria on terms and condition stated below to serve as Human Rights Volunteers. Initially ten persons shall be enrolled from within the jurisdiction of each of the Police Stations in the State of West Bengal. The Volunteers shall serve as the eyes and ears of WBHRC. The services rendered by them shall be completely voluntary and not in consideration of any remuneration/honorarium. The application form may be submitted online, a link for which shall be provided on the website of WBHRC from 01.03.2017. Application may also be submitted by post. In all cases the application must be accompanied by self attested photo copies of the relevant documents and an attested copy of a passport size photograph.

Eligibility

- 1) He should be Indian Citizen evidenced by Aadhar Card or EPIC Card.
- 2) He should possess a good moral character.
- 3) He should not be member of any political party.
- 4) He should not be member of any banned and or prohibited group/organization.
- 5) He should not have any criminal background or any criminal case pending against him.
- 6) He should be ready to render service free of cost to WBHRC for the citizens of India.
- 7) He should submit a written declaration as per SI No.(3) to (6)
- 8) He should be between the age of 30 and 70 years as on 01.01.17
- 9) He should be physically and mentally sound.
- 10) He should have at least one operational mobile phone for ready contact with him by the citizens and WBHRC.
- 11) He should have minimum educational qualification of Higher Secondary or equivalent from any recognized board.
- 12) He should be a resident of the jurisdictional area of the P.S. for which he may apply.
- 13) Teachers, Advocates, Doctors, other professionals, Engineers, Self Employed persons, retired Govt. Servants, shall be given preference.



Terms and conditions

- 1) The volunteer shall be engaged by WBHRC for a period of one year.
- 2) He may apply for renewal after one year which shall be considered based on his satisfactory performance.
- 3) He has to solemnly affirm or swear in the name of God that he shall take steps to uphold the provisions of The Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993.
- 4) The volunteer may be disengaged by the Commission in its absolute discretion without disclosing any reason.
- 5) He will be issued a certificate of appreciation after successful completion of the period of one year.
- 6) On his engagement, he will be issued an identity proof which will help him in discharging his voluntary service, not to be misused in any manner whatsoever.
- 7) The particulars furnished by the applicant for volunteer-ship shall be considered only after due police verification.
- 8) The Commission reserves its right to accept or reject any application without assigning any reason.

Functions

- 1) The Human Right Volunteer (HRV) shall be responsible for keeping watch in the cases of violation of Human Rights within the volunteer's jurisdiction; collect evidence in that regard and to keep the Commission informed about the same forthwith either by post or by e-mail or by SMS or on the Whats App (8585824919).
- 2) Omission to keep the Commission informed of any matter of Human Rights Violation, which may have come to the notice of Volunteer shall be treated as an act of dereliction on his part.
- 3) In no case the volunteer should overstep the function designated herein.
